We do this by:

Democracy

- Having a School Council
- Incorporating debating as part of our curriculum
- Allowing pupils to vote for House Captains
- Ensuring all pupils are listened to by adults

The Rule of Law

- Classes creating Class Rules
- Having a clear Positive Behaviour Policy that is explained to all
- Organising visits from the Police service to reinforce the message of right and wrong
- Highlighting the Ten Commandments and the teaching of the Church.

Individual Liberty

- Encouraging pupils to be independent in their learning
- Providing pupils with opportunities for reflection on responsibilities

Mutual Respect

- Having a Mission Statement which is inclusive
- Constantly promoting respect for one another as good manners
- Reinforcing the value of everyone's opinions in class
- Having an effective Anti-bullying Policy
- Emphasising in RE and PSHE lessons that every person is unique and 'created in the image of God'
- Supporting charitable works
