



## St Cuthbert's RCVA Primary School Sports Premium 2018-2019



Sports Premium funding is an amount of money which the government has agreed to allocate schools over an academic year. The funding amount schools receive is based upon the number of children from Year 1 upwards as well as a base amount of £16,000. Our Sports Premium allowance for the academic year 2018-2019 is £17,790. The premium will be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.
